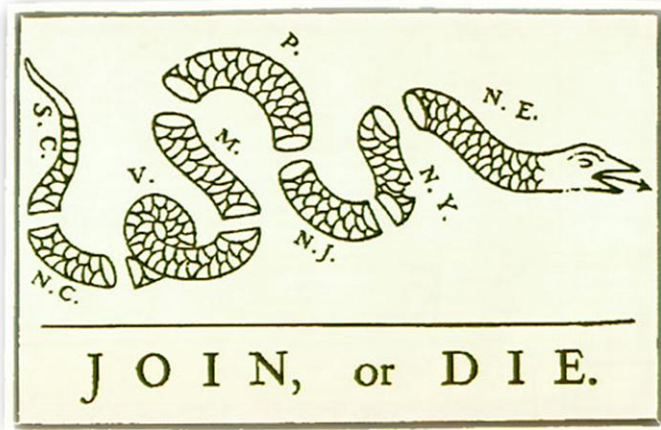

The turtles are meant to represent wartime producers. The student should mention something about the use of turtles to represent the slow pace that these producers were making materials for the war effort.

The “V” was used because it was a recognizable shape in the 1940s as “V” stood for victory. The student should mention something about this. They may also mention something about being promised “V-Home Certificates”.
